Essential information for parents/carers 2022/23

Attending school is very important

Here at Ramshaw Primary School we believe that the most important factor in promoting good attendance is the development of positive attitudes towards school. To this end, we strive to make our school a happy and rewarding experience for all children.

In May 2022 the Government set out new guidance to support schools in raising attendance in their settings. High attendance is extremely important if pupils are to make the best possible progress and reach their potential. Please see additional information on holidays in term time.

190 School Days & 175 Non School Days

190 School Days in each year = 190 days for your child's education

175 Non School Days in each year = 175 days to spend on family time and to attend non-urgent health appointments e.g. a routine eye test or dentist check up

Persistent Absence

If your child's attendance falls to 90% or below, this is considered, by Government to be persistent absence. Unauthorised absences may result in a referral to the local authority for enforcement action.

Severe Absence

This is when your child's absence falls below 50%.

Lateness

School starts promptly at 8.50 a.m. Your child will receive a late mark if they arrive after this time. The register closes at 9:10 a.m. If your child arrives after this time, they will receive an unauthorised absence mark.

If Your Child is Absent You Must:

- Contact school on each day of absence and provide a reason for absence by 8.40 a.m.
- Keep school informed on a regular basis if your child is absent for a long time.

Failure to do these things may result in your child's absence being unauthorised.

Unauthorised absences are recorded on the register when there is no valid reason given for absences, a holiday not approved by school, lateness after the register closes or illness without medical evidence.

Holidays/ Leave of Absence

In line with Durham Local Authority Guidance and the 2013 Amendment to the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulations, Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence to pupils during term time unless they consider there to be 'exceptional circumstances'. Any leave taken without prior consent will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

Please see our website for an application form and complete one form for each child. Unauthorised leave may result in a referral to the Local Authority and possibly a Fixed Penalty Notice (fine) or court prosecution.
